

All entrants should have a copy of the CHANNEL ISLANDS RACING & HUNT CLUB "RULES OF RACING". The Rules of Racing of the Channel Islands Racing and Hunt Club are published on the Club's website viz: <http://www.cirhc.co.uk> The Rules are no longer published in printed or written form.

ENTRIES These should be made in WRITING by **EMAIL, POST OR FACSIMILE** to: The Stakeholder, Guernsey Race Club, Donegal, Pleinmont Road, St. Peters, Guernsey, Channel Islands. GY7 9BN **EMAIL – GUERNSEYRACE@CWGSY.NET** - **Facsimile 01481 267381**, not later the 12 NOON on the closing date stated on the Race Bill and the Entry Form.

ENTRY FEES UK Trainers **are** required to pay their Entry Fees at the time of making an entry. Guernsey and Jersey Trainers **are not** required to pay their Entry Fee as an account will be opened in their name by the Stakeholder and accounts will be rendered following the end of the Race Meeting.

COLOURS These must be declared at the time of Declaration of Runners.

ELIMINATION If a horse is entered for a race for which it is not qualified, the entry fee will be charged, BUT no fee will be charged for horses eliminated by virtue of their rating. The maximum number of horses to start in a Guernsey race is 10. See CIRHC Rules of Racing 50(b).

DECLARATIONS OF RUNNERS These should be declared in WRITING by POST OR FACSIMILE, to the Stakeholder at the above address, TO BE RECEIVED NOT LATER THAN 12 NOON on the date stated on the Race Bill. No horse shall run in more than one race on any one day. See CIRHC Rules of Racing 44(iii). When LESS THAN TWO horses remain in a race at the final declaration stage, the 12 NOON DEADLINE MAY BE EXTENDED TO 7PM and entrants who have declared or not declared to run will be contacted and invited to reinstate. Horses declared for another race may transfer, provided that this does not leave less than two runners in that race. A ballot will be held if necessary. The decision of the Stakeholder or his representative, as to whether the race be abandoned, run as a walk-over or be subject to this condition, shall be final. The Guernsey Race Club draws attention to the fact that, while every effort will be made to contact entrants, this cannot be guaranteed.

NON-RUNNERS should a horse that has been declared to run then NOT RUN, the Trainer shall pay a PENALTY, unless he can satisfy the Stewards, in writing on the Race Day, that the failure of the horse to run was caused by circumstances beyond his reasonable control. Only if a Trainer, or his representative, was not present at the Race Meeting, will an appeal in writing to the Registry Office within 48 hours of the race, be considered.

THE 45 MINUTE DECLARATION All horses must be declared at the Racecourse at least 45 minutes before the race in which the horse will run. This DECLARATION may only be made by the TRAINER, OWNER OR AUTHORISED PERSON, registered by them with the CIRHC; OR an employee of the Trainer, on production of their Racehorse Attendant's Identity Card & Validity Pass; OR another person on production of a WRITTEN authorisation signed by the Trainer or Owner, valid only for the day of the race. See CIRHC Rules of Racing 55(l). Attention is drawn to the additional powers of the Stewards of the Meeting, regarding non-runners. See CIRHC Rules of Racing 64(iv).

All horses must be accompanied by A VALID PASSPORT, which should be handed in to the Clerk of the Scales. Please ensure that jockeys have a valid licence issued by the BHA or other recognised racing authority.

HAY OR HAYLAGE may be imported into Guernsey for your own use only. Peat or wood-shavings must be used on the floor of the horsebox.
